

## LEVELS

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LEVEL	DEFINITION
A1	Can understand familiar words and very simple sentences when spoken slowly and clearly. Can write a simple, short postcard and fill in simple forms.
A2	Can understand the most common words and single sentences. Can make a short contact conversation and communicate in simple, routine situations. Can write short notes and simple, personal letters.
B1	Can understand the main talking points if clear standard language is used. Can participate unprepared in conversations on familiar topics. Can speak in simple, coherent sentences and briefly explain plans and opinions. Can write short, coherent texts on familiar topics.
B2	Can understand longer speeches and follow even complex discussions if the topic is somewhat familiar. Can read and understand contemporary prose. Can actively participate in conversations and communicate spontaneously and fluently. Can explain a point of view on a topic of current interest. Can write clear and detailed texts on a variety of topics.
C1	Can follow longer, even unstructured conversations. Can express themselves fluently and spontaneously in speech. Can express themselves clearly and well in writing and articulate their views clearly. Use language effectively and flexibly in social and business contexts.
C2	He/she has no difficulty in understanding the spoken language. Can read and understand almost any written text effortlessly. Can speak fluently. Can write clear, fluent and stylistically appropriate texts for any situation.

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
